TECH TALENT TRENDS REPORT May 2018



RECRUITING with PURPOSE



DATA SUMMARY

There were 20,465 tech job postings listed in North Carolina in the month of April. This is a decrease of nearly **150 positions** when compared to March 2018, however, it is still 7.7% higher than April 2017's numbers.

The Research Triangle Park and Wilmington saw the highest increase in job postings, with each market up at least 13% compared to last year. Tech job postings with Lowe's, Deloitte, Cisco, and IBM continue to increase by over 100% compared to last year. Computer User Support Specialists, Network and Computer Systems Administrators, and Computer Systems Analysts all saw a drop in activity compared to 2017.

WHAT'S TRENDING IN RECRUITING?



The workplace is always evolving. Here are some new trends we've noticed in the recruiting and hiring process this year:

- Creative benefits regarding work flexibility remain a top priority for job seekers and employees. A 2017 <u>survey</u> conducted by FlexJobs showed that 81% of respondents would prefer the option to <u>telecommute</u> full-time, while 70% prefer a <u>flexible</u> <u>schedule</u>.
- 2. Tech positions **continue to grow** in non-tech sectors. To accommodate this rapid need for tech talent in non-tech industries, employers have expanded **continuous learning** opportunities aimed at nurturing and developing their tech talent. With increased training, certifications, and educational opportunities, employees can expand their skillset and be more qualified for advancing their career within your company.
- 3. As employees develop their skills, they often want to pursue other positions, either by seeking promotions in the same department, or pursuing new roles where they can make a lateral move. Offering **role experimentation** is **a creative way** to fill openings and provide opportunities for employees to **cross-train** into different departments.
