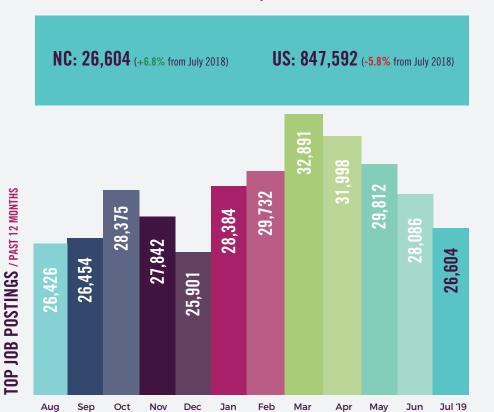

DATA SUMMARY

RECRUITING with PURPOSE

Job postings have stayed relatively consistent over the summer months of 2019. July showed only a slight dip from June with 26,604 total job postings. This is still 6.8% higher than July 2018. Charlotte and Raleigh are leading the state with over 18,000 open positions combined. Burlington is on the rise, growing 36% from 2018.

Software Developers remain in high demand and show no sign of slowing down. Other fast growing occupations include Computer and Information Systems Managers (+45.3%) and Software Quality Assurance Engineers (+33.3%). Angular and Middleware continue to be important skillsets in the industry. Postings with these skills grew 12,255% and 4,184%, respectively. The healthcare industry showed the strongest growth this month, increasing technology job postings by 20% from the same time last year.

WHAT'S TRENDING IN TECH HIRING?

50% of organizations have seen a significant increase in their use of contract employees over the last five years and the technology industry is no exception. Companies from Google to Amazon to Uber are utilizing contract employees to meet seasonal needs, keep costs low, and even hire for specialized skills.
