

Programming and Information Technology have made it to the TOP 10 Hard Skills / Certification list this month, replacing Oracle and Application Development on the list. Plus, Spectrum is hiring! This month, Spectrum has replaced CCI Companies on the TOP 10 list of Hirers of Tech Talent in North Carolina.
